

Honour Roll Criteria

Students must be taking a minimum of three four credit classes per semester

Students must have work habits that are meeting expectations (based on work habits assessment)

If students are taking online courses outside SD51, it is the student’s responsibility to provide the school with marks directly from their online teacher/school within the timelines for term and semester breaks.

Online course marks to be considered for Honour Roll must be either 25% complete for full year courses for each term calculation and 50% for semester end completion or 50% complete for semester long courses and 100% complete at semester end.

Year Long Course

Notification will be provided to students and parents through the school website/facebook page and school announcements

Honour Roll requires a 3.5 GPA or higher

Merit Roll requires a 3.0 to 3.49 GPA

Note: For grade 8 Honour Role/Merit Role calculations, the following 4 core courses will be used for the calculation: English 8, Science 8, Social Studies 8, and Math 8.

French 8, Russian 8, PE 8, and grade 8 electives are NOT included in the calculation.

Scholarship Criteria

For students on an academic program, the grade point average is based on the 10 best subject marks from grade 11 and 12, but must include the 5 core subjects and three grade 12 provincial examinable subjects (school mark) and then the best two grade 11 and/or 12 subjects.

Core subjects include: English or Communications 11, English or Communications 12, Social Studies 11, science 11, Math 11

For students on a vocational program, the grade point average is based on the 12 best subject marks but must include the 5 core subjects and three grade 12 level subjects and the best 4 grade 11 and/or 12 subjects.

Students taking online courses in their grade 11 or 12 years must complete 80% of their courses through GFSS to be eligible for internal scholarships.

Students who move into the district during their grade 12 year will have their grade 11 courses from their previous school considered as long as they are taking 80% of their grade 12 courses through GFSS.
