Red Dresses: What's It All About?



Have you seen red dresses around? They're a symbol for Red Dress Day, which is on May 5th. This day is about remembering Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and Two-Spirit people (MMIWG2S). Did you know that Indigenous women, girls, and Two-Spirit people are much more likely to face violence and go missing than other people?

Why red dresses? For many Indigenous people, red is a powerful colour that means life and strength. The empty dresses represent the women, girls, and Two-Spirit people who are missing and are missed by

their families. Red Dress Day started as an art project by an Indigenous artist named Jaime Black. She hung red dresses to show how many people have gone missing.

At GFSS, we recognize Red Dress Day to understand why this is happening and how it harms communities. It also gives us time and space to remember the MMIWG2S and support their families. Lastly, it promotes change with the hope of making our community safer for Indigenous people.

What's the Moose Hide Campaign?

Have you ever seen someone wearing a small moose hide pin? That pin is a sign of the Moose Hide Campaign. It's a movement started by Indigenous men in British Columbia to end violence against women and children. Why moose hide? In Indigenous cultures, the moose is a strong and respected animal and the hide is worn as a promise – a personal commitment by men and boys to honour, respect, and protect the women and children in their lives and to work to end violence.



The Moose Hide Campaign at GFSS on May 15 is about encouraging men and boys to speak out against violence and be part of the solution. It is a chance for our students to show respect and build healthy relationships to honour women and children. The Moose Hide Campaign brings Indigenous and non-Indigenous people together to create safer communities for everyone. Wearing a moose hide pin is a way to show your support and commitment. It's a small symbol with a big message: violence against women and children needs to stop. You might see people wearing them at school or in the community – it's a way to start important conversations.

Extra-curriculars activities (ECAs) and athletics shine

One of the great things about GFSS is the large offerings of ECAs! There is always so many options here; there is something for everyone. ECAs in action right now are: Mountain biking, Student Council, Warhammer, E-sports, Mindfulness, Yearbook, Drama, Announcements Crew, Sexuality and Gender Alliance, and Indigenous. Nk'Mip Desert Cultural Centre

On April 15th, our BC First Peoples 11/12 class had the opportunity to travel to Osoyoos with their Teacher, Ms Stuart to learn at the Nk'Mip Desert Cultural Centr. Students wereoined by GFSS Indigenous Education Assistant (Ms Phelps) and SD51 District Indigenous Elder-in-Residence (Joanie Homes). Students took part in a guided tour of the grounds, where they explored a traditional pit house, viewed artifacts, and learned about the cultural significance of the land.

Some highlights included an interactive teepee experience about the importance of salmon, a short film focusing on wolves, culture, and family, and a close-up look at some of the desert's native snakes. It was a rich and meaningful day of learning that deepened students' understanding of Indigenous knowledge, traditions, and connection to the land.




