
Health and Students' Absence

We remind everyone to be aware that no one should come to school if they are sick and unable to participate fully in routine activities. It is each of our responsibilities to practice health awareness.

Please advise the office (not just classroom teachers) if your child is going to be absent for any reason or any duration of time.

The absentee Auto-Dialer system is in place again this year. If your child has missed a block during the day and we have not been notified, the system will phone and email you. The system will not call if students are late for class, only for missed classes. Please let the office know if your contact information has changed so we can update it in the system.



We are pleased to share that the Parent Advisory Council (PAC) has conditionally approved the activation of internal security cameras at GFSS. Like security cameras in other public facilities, they are intended to enhance student safety

and school security while also helping to reduce costs associated with vandalism and willful damage to school property (over \$10,000 in recent years).

As a public school in BC, our privacy practices are regulated by the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA). The installation and use of security cameras will be in accordance with these regulations and district policies. The cameras will be located only in hallways (not classrooms nor washrooms nor changerooms). They will ideally be activated in October. As such, the cameras will not be monitored live but will provide video-only recordings that will be stored for up to 90 days before being automatically deleted. The recordings will only be reviewed by authorized school district staff and only if a concern is raised.

The PAC and school administration both want to ensure that our school community has an opportunity to share thoughts or concerns before moving forward. If you have more questions, please check out the FAQ, to learn more. If you would like to provide input, please share your comments with the PAC (GFSSPACCommunciations@gmail.com), who will ensure they are presented to the school administration.

Students and Families of GFSS,

Welcome to October at Grand Forks Secondary School. After a successful start to the school year we are in full swing in both our academic and extracurricular worlds. From time to time students may find themselves struggling with some of their courses, activities, or projects. Keep in mind that mistakes and challenges are all important parts of learning.

In schools, we often celebrate success, and rightly so. High grades, well-developed projects, and successful tests and quizzes are worth celebrating, but behind every success is a journey that involves setbacks, trial and error, and mistakes. At GFSS, we recognize that learning isn't just about getting the right answer, it's about developing the skills, mindset, and persistence to achieve goals, even when things get hard.

Struggling is not a sign of failure, rather it's a sign that *learning is happening*. When students encounter something difficult, they are being pushed beyond what they already know and can dothis is *productive struggle*. Although it can be uncomfortable or frustrating at times, this struggle develops deeper understanding of material, builds resilience and problem solving skills, improves learning retention, and increases student confidence when facing new challenges.

Teachers and support staff at GFSS develop structured rigour in their classrooms through high expectations for thinking, exploring big ideas and complex problems, and encouraging independence for their learners. As a staff, we are committed to challenging students appropriately, modelling growth mindset, and differentiating instruction. We don't remove the challenge, but we learn alongside our students as they learn to navigate the challenges.

As parents and caregivers, you can help support your students as well. Recognize and praise persistence and effort, not just the results. Normalize setbacks by sharing your own stories of learning through mistakes. And, encourage your child to ask questions and ask for help, not as a last resort, but as a part of everyday learning.

If you have questions or concerns, never hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher or school administration. We have a terrific Learning Support team that can help students with their learning, both in the short term as well as developing learning strategies they can apply to all of their learning experiences.

Enjoy the first days of autumn in this beautiful area we are so privileged to call home.




